Trees Atlanta received a grant for \$750 to support the creation of Atlanta BeltLine Arboretum Interpretation Stations for The Atlanta BeltLine Arboretum. With this funding and Craftsman Printing services, they were able to revise and reprint their arboretum brochures in April of 2017. They ordered 500 brochures and as of spring 2017, approximately 350 have been distributed.

#### **ABC Arboretum Collections Policy**

#### Introduction

ABC Arboretum is operated under a management plan which provides direction for the growth and development of plant holdings and associated facilities and functions. The plan defines guidelines for the arboretum and describes roles for the participating parties. It outlines the manner in which the living collections will develop and grow, and it charts the content of the arboretum and the general nature of its research and educational programs for the future. This policy is subject to the management plan, and is presented here as an extension and interpretation of the plan.





#### 2019 year in review

We'd like to reflect on what ArbNet accomplished this past year. In 2019, we grew substantially as a network, reaching out to new countries and becoming more globally focused; our community of accredited arboreta now includes over 350 institutions in 28 countries! One of our key focus areas last year was tree conservation. This was made possible by a grant from Fondation Franklinia, which enabled us to identify gaps and opportunities to support the conservation needs of our arboretum community, and to provide resources, guidance, and new international collaboration opportunities. 2019 was the first year of this three year grant, and we are very excited with what we have been able to achieve thus far.

As you may recall, we conducted a tree conservation needs assessment in 2019, which consisted of a series of survey questions that were answered by nearly 600 members of the ArbNet community. The purpose of the assessment was to obtain a better understanding of what the global community of arboreta and tree experts is currently doing to advance tree conservation and to identify key gaps and needs. We analyzed the survey results and compiled a detailed report, which includes a selection of relevant resources that address the major gaps highlighted by the analysis. We will use the results of the analysis to guide the development of new resources, programs, and funding opportunities that address the needs of our community. Thank you to all who completed the survey.

Last year marked the third annual BGCI/ArbNet Partnership Programme. We received 28 applications more than ever before! This funding opportunity supports the development of international collaborations between gardens and arboreta for the purpose of exchanging skills, resources and expertise to advance

### Oak Park named state's first municipal arboretum

April 13, 2015 - Decades of commitment to nurturing, diversifying and protecting its urban forest has earned Oak Park recognition as Illinois' first - and the nation's fourth - municipal arboretum.

The accreditation was announced in a letter to the Village from Gerard T. Donnelly, Phd., the president and chief executive officer of the venerable Morton Arboretum, which created the accreditation program to encourage knowledge, experience and resource sharing among keepers of tree-focused public gardens.

#### ARBNET ARBORETUM ACCREDITATION APPLICATION FORM

The AthNet Arboretum Accreditation Program provides standards and guidelines for the establishment and development of an arboretum. The goals of the accreditation program are to:

- 1) foster the establishment and professionalism of arboreta;
- identify arboreta capable of participating or collaborating in certain scientific, collections, or conservation activities; and
- 3) advance the planting, study, and conservation of trees to improve the world.

Arboreta that are accredited are encouraged to become leaders and serve as models to promote professional development and engagement with other arboreta.

Different levels of accreditation have been established to recognize arboreta at varying degrees of development, capacity, and professionalism. Accredited arboreta are encouraged to continue their growth and development to achieve higher professional standards.

Arboreta and public gardens are eligible to apply for accreditation by submitting this form along with supporting documentation to demonstrate their level of achievement according to the specified standards. Once the application is completed, a decision will usually be made within four weeks. A site visit by an  $A_t h N_t = 1$  to the proper part of the accreditation process.

The ArbNet Arboretum Accreditation Program is sponsored and supported by The Morton Arboretum, Botanic Gardens Conservation International (BGCI), and the American Public Gardens Association (APGA).
